

MANAGER REPORT 2020

Things that happened last half of 2020

- Jeannie started as Airport Manager July 27th
- COVID was in high alert
- Donation of bikes for visitors
- Donation of BBQ grill
- Crew Car donation
- Disposal of Mercedes and Malibu.
- An airplane gear up crash landing happened
- Enplanements were cut by half for Kenmore and San Juan Air due to COVID-Kenmore hit the hardest as they don't run much freight
- Old growth cedar tree caught fire on West side during hot dry time. Parks and Recreation Department received the burned remains of the tree to use in the new playground in town.
- Started talks with ESWD to sell them 10'x112' of land for their much-needed expansion to handle the volume.
- Master Plan Review finalizing process with few minor changes. Still pending FAA approval
- Hanger inspections began.
- Ist Annual Fly Washington Passport Food Drive collected over 400 lbs (highest in the state) for our local food bank
- Craftsman Corner land use overage was discussed and coming to conclusions.
- Worked with the local Fire Department on Emergency Evacuation plans and what it would take from both teams.

FACILITY REPORT

- The battle with PAPI 34 and 3 FAA flight checks shutting off the PAPI's, 2021 will bring a new PAPI
- Inspections on all Port owned hangers and buildings happened
- Fuel tank monitor was broken and a new one was installed.
- Rains flooded hangers in the perfect storm including the terminal sewer tank backed up into terminal from ground water intrusion.
- Flightradar24 became a partner. 2021 will bring a host unit to Orcas to help with ADSB coverage (increased safety for pilots) in the local area and a free subscription for the Port.
- Craftsman Corner land use overage was discussed and coming to conclusions.
- Terminal bathroom remodels started and will be finished the end of January 2021 including all touchless faucets, hand towels, and soap dispensers
- Deer fencing was repaired on the North and South End
